Taste That! 'Tortilla Lime Soup'

Ingredients:

1 pound chicken breast; cooked and shredded

1 medium onion

1/4 jalapeno pepper, diced

2 cloves garlic

4 cans chicken broth

2 cups water

4 chicken bouillon cubes

2 tsp cilantro

1 cup enchilada sauce

4 corn tortilla shells

Cook chicken thoroughly; shred when cool.

Sauté onion, jalapeno and garlic.

Combine all ingredients except tortilla shells in a saucepan and cook over medium heat. About 20 minutes.

Slice tortilla shells and put in soup just before serving.
