Plant "Imagination"



Snowdrops (Galanthus nivalis)

Snowdrops will pop out even before the crocuses and can even survive a late snow by waiting until the weather is more suitable. Small, white, bell-shaped flowers of the snowdrop are suspended from short, delicate stems and will only reach about six inches unless you plant one of the newer hybrids which can get up to ten inches. Well-drained soil that is kept moist will keep them doing well in hot weather, they do not like getting dry. These little snowdrops need a cold winter in order to really do well. Welcome to Minnesota. Zones 2-7

So if you decide to plant them find a sheltered spot. Start the bulbs or do your dividing in spring after the last frost. They are nice around the base of trees or under shrubs.

Taste That!

Chicken & Vidalia Onion Dumplings - Serves 4-6

2 Vidalia onions, 1 diced finely and 1 roughly chopped

3 Tbsp olive oil, divided

1 C all purpose flour

1 ½ tsp baking powder

½ tsp salt

3/4 Cup Milk

1 ½ tsp chopped fresh thyme and sage

2 large carrots, roughly chopped, about 1 ½ cups

2 cloves chopped garlic

6 cups Chicken broth

2 tablespoons cornstarch

2 tablespoons flour

½ cup frozen peas (note: I don't add the peas - Anne)

1 rotisserie chicken, meat pulled, about 3 cups

¹/₄ cup heavy cream (note: I don't add the heavy cream - Anne)

Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste

In a 6 quart pot, heat 2 Tbsp olive oil over medium heat. Add the finely diced onion and cook until tender and just beginning to brown. With a fork, mix together flour, baking powder, salt, and milk into a dough. Fold in the herbs and cooked finely diced onions. Add remaining Tbsp of oil to pan, then the roughly chopped onions and carrots and cook until they begin to soften, about 6-8 minutes. Add garlic and cook 2 more minutes.

Combine the cornstarch and flour in a small bowl. Slowly add the heavy cream to the cornstarch/flour mixture Add the chicken broth to the pan and bring to a boil. Whisk the cream mixture into the broth and continue cooking and whisking until thickened, about 5 minutes

Add chicken broth, bring to a boil. Add peas and chicken. Drop spoonfuls of dough into the broth; should be about 12. Reduce heat to maintain a simmer, cover and cook for 15 minutes. Add heavy cream and season to taste.

Note: I leave out the peas and the heavy cream.
