#### **Current News & Notes**

The annual and perennial beds at the Muriel Sahlin Arboretum in Roseville that are maintained by the Lake Owasso Garden Club will close soon, if not already, for the season. The arboretum, started in 1998, was

funded by several individuals, and the Lake Owasso Garden Club who received a grant from the Shell Oil Company and had to come up with funds to



match the grant. That first expenditure was for a collection of shrubs seen near the wedding gazebo which was purchased with memorial money and other funds in memory of a LOGC member who passed away. Did you know that Muriel Sahlin, who loved Central Park, left a bequest of \$500,000 sometime in the early 2000s to Roseville's Central Park Foundation after her death in 2000

at age 84? A little bit of history—the Roseville park system was shaped in the 1960s under the leadership of Frank Rog who was head of Park and Rec at the time. The Central Park Foundation, which collects donations on behalf of park improvements and gives it to the park and rec department for specific projects, started in 1965.

A big overhaul of the park, including improvements to the arboretum, took place in 2015 through 2016. The arboretum consists of 8 acres with a central fountain, theme gardens, paved paths, and a pavilion for special events, such as weddings.

When the Roseville Park and Rec Dept. decided to add the raised annual bed, the LOGC was asked to design, plant, and maintain the bed. For 8 plus years it has been a teaching tool for/by LOGC members.

Activities at the Arboretum in the past or present by LOGC include purchasing the shrubs by the entrance gazebo, helping to weed and keep up the grounds, putting in and maintaining the butterfly garden, taking care of the rose

garden in Central Park, planting and maintaining annual planters by City Hall and by the Library on Hamline, and planting a vegetable garden to teach children at the Lake Owasso Children's Home how to grow and use a vegetable garden.

# Financial Report

The Lake Owasso Garden Club is a nonprofit organization which has three sources of income: member dues, occasional donations from members and/or guests, and the net profit from their annual sale of garden plants. The balance of funds available in the bank as of May 20, 2022 is \$19,094.85. Funds are used to pay the monthly speakers, occasionally fund special projects to benefit the members, cover Club expenses, and to underwrite annual donations to the following: Minnesota Horticulture Society, the Roseville Arboretum, the Como Park Conservatory in St. Paul, and scholarships distributed by the Federated Garden Clubs of Minnesota.
